


## **Diagnosis of Canine Multicentric Lymphoma in Dog**

The histopathological examination of lymphoma in dogs (A), H and E staining for lymphoma cell; the cytological appearance of an immunocytochemical staining for CD3 (B) and CD79a (C) on a lymph node aspirate demonstrating CD79a-reactivity for the neoplastic B-cells and CD3-reactivity for the reactive T-cells consistent with a high-grade B-cell lymphoma). The tumor cells were large and showed a pleomorphic appearance, and the boundaries between the cells were obvious and showed a patchy pattern.

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
